<p>Hamburg Stipendium - Studierendewerk Hamburg supports Hamburg students with a migration or refugee background whose parents did not attend university in Germany. As a Hamburg scholarship holder, you do not only receive financial support, but you also become part of the network. <p>Grundförderung für Ausländerinnen – With this program, the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung supports refugees and international students who are already enrolled in a German higher education institution. <p>Stipendium für Geflüchtete – Evangelisches Studienwerk Villigst offers a scholarship for refugee students. You must not yet have exceeded the 3rd semester and have German language skills at the C1 level.</p>	<p>www.evstudienwerk.de/bewerbung/gefluechtete/unsere-stipendium.html</p>
<p>Flüchtlingsstipendienprogramm – Brot für die Welt supports female students who are persecuted or threatened in their country of origin for political, religious or ethnic reasons. You can apply for any bachelor's or master's degrees and if you can demonstrate developmental, social, socio-political or ecumenical commitment. Applicants must be in Germany at the time of application. The maximum participant age is generally 35 years, although justified exceptions are possible. Students cannot apply directly for these scholarships, rather they must be recommended by a Protestant Student Congregation. 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Subject-specific scholarships	
<p>Horizonte - The Claussen-Simon Foundation supports student teachers at the University of Hamburg with a migration background. You will receive both financial and non-material support for a maximum of two years. You should have good to very good grades. <p>Medienvielfalt, anders – The Heinrich Böll Foundation supports students with a migration background who want to pursue a career in journalism. You should have initial journalistic experience as well as very good performance, social commitment and political interest. <p>Schotstek – The Hamburg-based initiative Schotstek supports students who have immigrated alone or come from immigrant families. Seminars, networks, coaching, mentoring and much more are offered.</p>	<p>www.schotstek.com</p>
<p>Welcome - The Deutsche Universitätsstiftung offers a scholarship for Bachelor students: You will receive 1:1 support from a university lecturer close to your subject and place of study, workshops, coaching and training for the duration of your first degree. There is an annual budget for study-related costs. Application requirement: German language skills at C1 level.</p>	
<p>Hochform – The Deutsche Universitätsstiftung in cooperation with the Walter Blüchert Foundation supports academics with a refugee background through idealistic support and book money. Requirements are a recognized refugee status, a first academic degree, the study of a MINT subject and very good German language skills (C1).</p>	<p>www.hochform.org</p>
<p>Diversity Initiative – The Fulbright Commission sponsors a four-week summer study program in the USA for students with a migrant background. 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<p>Medicus - The German University Foundation offers a scholarship for medical students: 1:1 mentoring by university lecturers close to the subject and place of study. Admission via the Tandem and Welcome Program. After the Physics exam, the medical students switch to the Medicus program.
